

Pick one of the examples that Feynman uses in his piece (the dinosaur, the birds, or the wagon) and in 2-3 paragraphs explain both the example and the lesson Feynman's father was trying to teach him with it.

Feynman's dad was reading him the Encyclopædia Britannica, his dad stopped and he said "This dinosaur is twenty-five feet high and its head is six feet across."

He would connect to reality by saying "The dinosaur is tall enough to put his head through the window on the 2nd floor but his head would be too wide to fit." The lesson he was teaching Feynman was that scientists observe objects.
